The Board were informed that the estate has been in decline for several years and the site owner is exploring proposals to develop the site into a living environment. The land is currently designated as Employment Land, but the DCC Strategic Housing and Land Availability Assessment recognises the land as suitable and deliverable as a Housing site. At a size of 850,000 sq. ft. the proposal is to develop approx 500 homes with a district centre.

A commitment has been given to consultation with the Board and community on the proposed development. Initial concerns raised are:

Access and traffic flows

Traffic access points

Questioning the need for housing in the location

Concern about the impact on the community and crime

18/11 | SAFE GUARDING

Insp. Kam Bria, accompanied by Neil Glover provided a verbal response to concerns raised in relation to a perceived Registered Sex Offender living in the area.

Board members were reassured that when offenders in this category are housed, checks and research into the location are carried out. Risk Management Plans are put in place based on the history and potential to re-offend. This is agreed through Multi Agency Public Protection Arrangements. Police decide on the locations which are safe and manageable and monitor individuals on a regular basis.

Offenders who are not on the register have no restrictions.

Graeme Walton advised that an Allocations System is in operation for Derby Homes Tenants, but they have a statutory duty to house people. Background checks are completed on individuals and families and takes into account previous tenancy, known history, probation and police checks.

Derby Homes Local Managers report

Vacant properties

We currently have 17 vacant properties in Osmaston and Sinfin. 5 of these properties have been acquired from Guinness Northern Counties Housing Association and are on Tower Street and Buchan Street. We are in the process of modernising these prior to letting them. Vacant properties are brought up to a lettable standard as quickly as possible, and our target is to turn them round in an average of 23 days.

Arrears

Rent arrears in the Sinfin area currently stand 9.29% behind target (£10,183.77). In Osmaston they are 10.57% behind target (£14,641.92)

Kitchen improvement programme

We have started a kitchen replacement programme in Osmaston and Allenton. We are currently working at the Spider Island end of Marlborough Rd, Addison Road, Amber Street, Buchan Street, Campbell Street, Fenwick Street, Latimer Street, Mowbray Street, Osmaston Park Road, Osmaston Road, Peveril Street, Tennyson Street, Tower Street, Varley Street and Waverley Street.

Traveller's Site, Russell Street

Work is ongoing on the new Traveller's site. It is expected to be completed in September and we are currently working with the Travellers to manage the process of moving from Glossop Street to the new site. The Glossop Street site will be secured by the Council as soon as we have vacant possession of it.

CESP

The Community Energy Saving Programme will improve the energy efficiency of around 600 Derby Homes properties across Osmaston, Sinfin, Austin and Cowsley. Work is currently being completed in Austin, and includes thermal insulation, loft insulation and replacement of central heating systems.

Rolls Rovce

Have been discussing post demolition and progressing a number of issues linked to the Nightingale Rd site with DCC, Derby Homes, Streetpride etc.

Attending the first meeting with OSCAR on 06 July 2011. Debbie Duro is the agreed RR representative for OSCAR. In discussion with OSCAR with regards to team challenge activities.

Working with Community Action and a number of key partners to develop a Volunteering Action Plan which aims to increase the proportion of Derby people who regularly volunteer. Also offering RR training programmes to their members.

RR has project managed a Charity Ball for First Steps Derbyshire, Osmaston Rd.
