4.	Minutes of the Previous Meeting and Matters Arising Councillor Shiraz Khan said he was at the meeting, but this was not reflected in the minutes. The Minutes of the meeting held on Thursday 16 th December 2010 were noted as an accurate record of meeting. Matters Arising There were no matters arising.	

5.	<p>Arboretum Neighbourhood Board Budgets 2010/2011</p> <p>5.3.2 Community Budget Applications for funding</p> <p>The Board recommended to fund the following from the Community Budget:</p> <p>Arboretum Bowls Pavilion £1000.00 Roma Pupils Road Safety Project £650.00 The Roma Pupils Road Safety Project is subject to the following questions being answered satisfactory:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • How is the project targeting the Roma Young People • What will be done specifically in the Arboretum Ward <p>Normanton Park Orienteering- £269.06 (An additional £240.94 will be funded through the Highways, Youth and Community Safety Budget, the total funding recommended towards this project is £510)</p> <p>5.4.2. Highways, Youth and Community Safety budget</p> <p>The Board agreed to fund the following from the Highways, Youth and Community Safety budget:</p> <p>Normanton Park Orienteering- £240.94 (An additional £269.06 will be funded through the Community Budget, the total funding recommended towards this project is £510) Further funding towards installation 8 meter lampposts £782.75 They agreed to go with the cheaper option of supply of an additional column within three meters of current column to allow for all requested columns to be funded. Ashley Lewis will pay for the Moore Street Column from the Streetpride Devolved budget.</p> <p>The Board rejected the following applications for funding: Car Seat Safety Checks- The Board felt it was low value for money. This project could be incorporated into the Roma Pupils Road Safety Checks. Flytipping princess Street- The flytipping has occurred on private land which the Board felt should not be funded through public funds. Ashley Lewis said he would liaise with Ian Donnelley from Environmental Protection regarding potential other solutions. No Ball Games Signs- As there currently is no Anti Social Behaviour related to ball games taking place on Arboretum Square, the Board felt this was not currently a priority.</p>	
6.	<p>Absentee Landlords</p> <p>Adele Styles raised the issue of absentee landlords, and the</p>	

	<p>problems this has caused her and others over the last 7 years.</p> <p>Problems include anti social behaviour, noise nuisance, overcrowdedness, flytipping and more.</p> <p>She added that issues such as these were widespread across Normanton and Arboretum, and it causes people to move away from the neighbourhood.</p> <p>Because of the high amount of properties with similar problems housing standards and other agencies haven't got the capacity to deal with the issues quickly. They also face issues around quick turn over of tenancy, which means that they cannot prosecute because tenants would have moved away before enough evidence is gathered.</p> <p>The Councillors agreed to raise these issues with the relevant portfolio holder.</p> <p>Inspector Keene agreed to look into the possibility of an ASB closure order on the property Adele referred to, to set an example to other landlords that this behaviour is unacceptable.</p>	<p>Cllr Farhatullah Khan and Shiraz Khan</p> <p>Inspector Keene</p>
7	<p>Feed back Voices in Action</p> <p>Monica Bailey fed back that she attended the 'Voices in Action' event in December. She had felt it was really useful to listen to the young peoples views and felt it was important these would be fed back to the Arboretum Board.</p> <p>Zia Bhatti mentioned that local young people who attended the voices in action event had also been invited to the Shadow Youth Board Consultation event, so hoped their views would be fed in to the Board through the panels.</p>	
8.	<p>Arboretum Board Subgroups Progress Report</p> <p>Imke presented the Arboretum Board Subgroups progress report.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A highways subgroup has been arranged for 16th February • A communications Subgroup has been arranged for 9th February at Fairedene Court. <p>All Board members were asked to attend a subgroup of interest.</p> <p>The report was noted.</p>	
9.	Shadow Youth Board	

	<p>Zia Bhatti mentioned that a Shadow Youth Board Consultation Event would take place on 3rd February 2011. He expected around 50 to 100 young people to take part in the event. The young people attending the event will be encouraged to take part in the Shadow Youth Board.</p>	
10.	<p>Neighbourhood Youth Justice Panels</p> <p>Imke explained about the 'Neighbourhood Youth Justice Panels', which provide an opportunity for the Youth Offending Service (Community Safety Partnership) and Neighbourhood Boards to work collaboratively and pilot these panels.</p> <p>Aims of the Panel are to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> § provide a place where young offenders would have to explain their actions to their victims in front of community volunteers from the local neighbourhood. § direct a way forward for young people who have admitted to low level crime or anti-social behaviour. § allow a discussion to take place with the young person as to the circumstances of the offence and the reasons behind the offence and to encourage the young person to take responsibility for their actions. § work with the young person to draw up a contract including a programme of activities aimed at repairing the harm caused by the offence addressing the causes of the offending behaviour. § Improve public awareness as to the work of the criminal justice system. <p>All community volunteers would be trained by the Youth Offending Service before taking part in the initiative.</p> <p>Imke asked if the Board would be interested in piloting this project, and if so, if there were any volunteers for these panels.</p> <p>Monica Bailey said she had received training for the city wide Youth Justice Panel but was never asked to take part. She would be interested in taking part in the local initiative. Adele Styles asked if non board member residents could be on the panel. Imke said they could. Adele said she would be interested. Ashley Waterhouse had already left the meeting, but it was suggested Imke should contact him to ask if he is interested in attending. Councillor Farhatullah Khan also expressed an interest.</p>

12.	<div>Petition Portland Street</div> <div>Councillor Farhatullah Khan reported back on the petition received by Normanton Board concerning resident only parking on Portland Street. He added that the Arboretum Board has been invited to submit recommendations on the petition, as part of the area discussed in the petition is in the Arboretum ward.</div> <div>Imke was asked to feed back the following recommendation on behalf of the Arboretum Board: The Arboretum Board is not in favour of 'resident only scheme' as they feel this will not resolve the issue. They recommend that Highways continue to explore alternative options and continue their dialogue with the petitioner.</div>	IG
13.	<div>Late Items</div> <div>Local Development Framework: Revised approach and timetable for Core Strategy development</div> <div>Imke reported back on the revised approach and time table for the core strategy. This revised approach would include further consultation and it was requested that for Arboretum this takes place at the Arboretum neighbourhood Forum at St Chads School in March.</div> <div>The Board agreed for the consultation to take place at their March forum.</div>
