# **Disposal of Museum Reserve Collections**

## **SUMMARY**

- 1.1 On 22 November 2011 Cabinet agreed that Derby Museums adopt a new procedure to actively manage its reserve collections. Part of this involves reporting a list of all items proposed for disposal by sale to the Cabinet.
- 1.2 This report contains a list of items recommended for disposal by sale. These are all items which have been assessed by museum staff as no longer falling within the museum's Collections Development Strategy, and in most cases not being of sufficient museum quality.
- 1.3 Any money raised through this procedure can only be used for the benefit of the museum collections, and will be directed to the museum's conservation and specimens budgets. There was no money raised from the disposal of the items on the first list approved in April 2012.

#### RECOMMENDATION

2.1 To note the proposed list of items recommended to Cabinet for disposal by sale in Appendix 2, in accordance with the Council's support for active management of reserve collections within the Museums in Derby.

#### REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

3.1 To allow active management through sale of objects not of sufficient museum quality to be retained, and where offer by transfer or sale to museums or institutions within the public domain, or return to original donor, has not been successful.

#### SUPPORTING INFORMATION

- 4.1 Central to the active management procedure already agreed by Cabinet is a report to Cabinet approximately every three months seeking approval for the disposal by sale of selected items from the Museums' reserve collections. This is in line with the recommendations of the Museums Association, of which Derby Museums is an institutional member.
- 4.2 This report contains, at Appendix 2, a list of items recommended to Cabinet for disposal by sale. The list explains why each item is being recommended for disposal and outlines attempts that have already been made to offer them to other museums and, where appropriate, to trace the original donor.
- 4.3 As well as recommending further items for disposal the next report to Cabinet will record any income generated by the sale of the items listed at Appendix 2.

#### OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED

5.1 All the items listed have been offered, without success, to other museums. Where possible we have also attempted, unsuccessfully, to trace the original donor with a view to offering to return the item.

#### **IMPLICATIONS**

#### **Financial and Value for Money**

- 1.1 Any costs associated with disposals can be achieved within existing Museum Trust budgets.
- 1.2 In accordance with the ethics code of the Museums Association, Cabinet agreed on 22 November 2011 that any income generated by the sale of the items disposed of through this process will be retained by the Museum Service "solely and directly for the benefit of the museum's collections". It is anticipated that the income generated by the sale of the items listed will be minimal.
- 1.3 Any write off of assets will be authorised by the Council in accordance with Financial Procedure Rule E8.32, which states that Chief Officers can approve the write off of redundant stock and equipment up to £10,000 if the assets are recorded as an asset within the Council's accounts. It is not anticipated that write offs above £10,000 will occur which need the approval of Council Cabinet.

#### Legal

2.1 Ownership of the collections is legally vested in Derby City Council. The Council must be able to show beyond reasonable doubt that it has legal title to objects which are candidates for dispersal or sale.
