Estates Pride Funding

Derby Homes allocates funds each year from its Estates Pride allocation to deliver small scale improvement works that are identified by either local residents or local housing staff. There is also a budget available for larger scale projects. If there any suggestions for estate improvements, and they are on land managed by Derby Homes, please contact us if you have any ideas to put forward.

We are currently working on the following projects. **North**

- Improvements to be made to the communal courtyard area at Farndale Court. Fencing and gates to be fitted to pathways of flats and resurfacing of the courtyard area in front of the flats.

We have also completed the following works this year: **North**

- Bulb planting on green spaces areas near Wilkins Drive. A resident and community activity which was completed November 2023.
- Renewal of the planters in the communal garden at Slaney Close. The old and broken planters were removed and replaced with brand new planters. These were filled with soil and compost and were left empty at the request of

the residents so they could plant their own flowers and plants as a community. Completed September 2023.

- To design and erect a pergola in the community room garden with outdoor seating at Slaney Close. At the request of the community room users and residents, so that the outdoor space can be utilised and enjoyed by the residents and community. Completed September 2023.

Report for Alvaston, Allenton and Wilmorton Neighbourhood board meeting

November 2023

Kate White – Local Area Coordinator – Alvaston North ward

The Local Area Coordination team walk alongside individuals who live within the communities in which we work, with a focus on preventing, reducing and/ or delaying the need for people to access more formal services. Our role involves:

- Ensuring that the residents we come into contact with have access to accurate and timely information and are supported to make best use of information they receive
- Providing people that request our support the offer of a long-term relationship where we can walk alongside them to address the problems they are facing
- Supporting people to build networks, relationships and connections with other people who also live in the local community
- Attempting to build relationships of trust with the people we work with and support them to have their voice heard, think about their vision for a good life and take positive steps towards achieving their goals
- Making the most of the groups, organisations and activities that already take place in the local neighbourhood, and by supporting the development of new opportunities.

I have over 40 people open to me currently, and am actively supporting 23 of these, which feels close to capacity. Those I am not actively supporting are still open to me but I am not seeing regularly, and they will contact me as they need my support. There are a few where their engagement with me has reduced for various reasons and they are in a position where I can soon close them on the system. The introductions have been coming from a variety of sources, such as the GP surgeries, hospital, Mental Health Crisis team, Adult Social care.

We are never totally closed to anyone we have supported, as they are able to get in contact with us at any later date should they wish to, and we can resume the support with them.

I have received a number of introductions where the person is still in quite a chaotic situation, and often some more practical support is required before their life can move forward. This type of introduction seems to be increasing. I have also had an increased number of people who have suffered huge trauma in their life, and it can be difficult hearing about their experiences and a challenge for them to imagine a better life than they currently have.

Mental health difficulties is one of the biggest themes I am dealing with. Many people are coping with depression and anxiety, and particularly social anxiety. It is a cycle where depression causes a person to stay at home and then because they get out of the habit of going out and socialising the social anxiety builds up. I make use of the excellent community groups in Alvaston and Allenton at the churches and the library to encourage those I am walking alongside to start socialising in a safe and welcoming space, but this can be a slow process by building up the trust with that person and supporting the attendance initially and allowing confidence to build hopefully to a point where they are comfortable attending a group session without my attendance.

Social isolation continues to be a big issue, especially amongst those residents who don't have a family support network to rely on. For those with restricted mobility, transport continues to be a barrier to them getting out and mixing socially.

Cost of living continues to be an issue and with colder weather upon us, this is only going to worsen. I will be encouraging people to attend the Warm Spaces in the area.

The many community groups in the area are a brilliant asset to Alvaston, and I would struggle to do my job without them, providing a social lifeline for many people. I try to visit them as I can to keep in contact with groups in the area, and to create a visible presence for people who may reach out for support.

Case Study:

DC has had mental health issues for many years. He has depression and severe anxiety, which meant he had been spending most of his time in his flat on his own. He also has a physical disability which affects his mobility. I started to walk alongside him in May this year, having been introduced to him by his Occupational Therapist. We started by meeting in Alvaston and having a short walk. We then met a few times in Alvaston Park for a walk, and then D's confidence increased for us to go into the café after a walk. Because he really enjoyed being outside and in nature, we visited YMCA more recently to have a look at their allotment/green space, and D is hoping to start attending a support group they have there.

We have now met up a few times at cafes, in the library and been to a drop-in session run by Derby County Community Trust. We are now starting to talk about volunteering, as I have recognised that one of D's strengths is his kindness and consideration of others.

He has also now been to visit his Mum and Sister at their houses, something he had not done for years, relying on them visiting him instead. This was a big thing for D, and his family have acknowledged how much his confidence has grown.

He has now bought a mobility scooter to enable him to get out more, and independently, which shows how his confidence and motivation have grown.

Locality Team

The Local Area Coordination team is now part of the Community Safety and Locality Working team within Derby City Council and I am now part of Locality 2 team. This comprises the 4 wards of Alvaston North; Alvaston South; Chellaston and Shelton Lock; and Sinfin and Osmaston. We have begun to have regular team meetings with our Locality colleagues and have started to work on priorities for the Locality Plans.


Guinness Housing Fun Day - 8th August 2023
