- Schools distribute codes to pupils/families
- £20 per pupil per week

Key points of Note

- Ave days from application to award is 3.7 days
- Families with children 56% of awards paid
 - Covering 5,365 children,
 - 79% are single parent families
- 13% failed checks 695 claims
- Forecast scheme closure end of Feb 2023

3. Community network - £502K

- 51 organisations across each ward have signed up to the Community Network
- Funding of £200k has been allocated to these organisations
- A 2nd tranche of organisations will be added in Jan 2023 another £80k funding
- New Energy Support Form has been launched for use by this network
- 309 referrals made in 9 days £15.5k
- Also set up as referrers into HSF3






Challenges
