Performance Overview

- Increase in total crime
 - Up 2.6% on Q1 (23,085 up from 22,503)
 - Particular poor performance in key areas:
 - Assault with less serious injury
 - Domestic Violence
 - Serious Violent Crime
 - Serious Acquisitive Crime (particularly domestic burglaries)
- } Alcohol?
- Mainly attributable to high figures in June affecting the rolling 12 month figures – even in areas that had low quarterly figures
 - Impact of this will continue to be felt throughout next year




Serious Violent Crime, Assault with less serious injury and the City Centre

- Serious Violent Crime (NI 15) and Assault with less serious injury (NI 20) both indications of alcohol related crime
 - Also recorded by Police 'flag' on alcohol related incidents
 - Used together can get a fuller picture of alcohol related crime in the city
 - As recorded by this system, alcohol related crime approaching the highest levels ever recorded

Alcohol Related Crime

- City Centre accounts for one third of all recorded offences
 - Rate increased by 2.7% in quarter 2, compared to 2% in areas outside the city centre
- Looking at NI 15 and NI 20 shows some interesting patterns






Serious Acquisitive Crime

- Traditionally a success story in Derby
 - September 2007 – 12 month rolling total was 5,307
 - June 2010 – 12 month rolling figure total was 3,586
 - 32.4% reduction overall, even in hard economic times when usually see increases
 - However, have been increases in Q2

Serious Acquisitive Crime

- Also increases in theft of non-precious metals
- Since 1 April 2010 there have been 315 recorded metal thefts across Derby
 - Includes theft of lead from roofs and scrap metal – mainly due to the high value of the items
- High value of copper and lead has led to targeting of churches, schools and building sites
