## **Project Summary 6**

#### S.S.A.I.N

The Board discussed this application for funding of £1,500.00 towards a legal challenge against an Incineration Plant.

The Board discussed this at length and the majority approved this application. However the Board wanted the following clauses in place. They are as follows:

- If this money is not spent on legal fees towards the challenge against Sinfin Incinerator then it is to be returned to the Sinfin Neighbourhood Board.
- Proof of the £1,500.00 must be supplied to the Sinfin Neighbourhood Board when this money is spent on the legal challenge against the Sinfin Incinerator.

Following the discussion of all the funding applications the Board asked that the groups requesting funding attend the Board meetings to answer any questions about their funding bid.

## LTP Priority 2013-14

Graeme confirmed that the LTP priorities chosen for 2013-14 are:

- Implementation of pedestrian crossing on Elton Road dependant on the outcome of the investigations
- Improved cycle routes around the Ward, mainly around Rolls Royce site areas

• Investigating and implementing safety features to tackle parking around Ashcroft Primary School on Deepdale Lane.

Ideas to Graeme & Jonathan Streetpride Devolved Budget 2013/14 Graeme confirmed that the Streetpride funding ideas for 2013/14 are as follows: SID moves Renewal of litter bins nest to Shakespeare Street play area Deep clean – Old Sinfin area Repair/replace railings at Sinfin Lane/Grampian Way roundabout Repair/replace railings on footpath next to Shakespeare Street play area Additional bollards to Osmaston Park Road grass verges (Spider Island end) Pathway/shrub bed improvements to streets from Islay Road to **Cromarty Close**  Dropped Kerbs around Merlin Green Provision of parking facility on land between 332 and 334 Osmaston Park Road Alterations to turning head/roadway to alleviate congestion/parking problems on Jedburgh Close Highway improvements to prevent parking of articulate vehicles overnight on Wilmore Road Graeme mentioned that the Ward will be getting a deep cleansing on one of the Streets without having to use Board funding. The location has not been chosen as of yet. Prices will be gathered for these Streetpride suggestions and it is likely only a few of them will be delivered due to costs. **Partner Updates**
