Derby City Council Helps Householders Save Energy

About 1,350 Derby householders have received Government grants to make their homes warmer and help them save energy in the last year.

Derby City Council promotes, and helps eligible residents apply for, the Government's Warm Front grant for insulation or heating improvements. It is available to **private tenants and owner-occupiers** who get an income-related or disability benefit or credit. In the last year, the Council has particularly targeted people on Council Tax or Housing Benefit.

All 103,000 Derby households and 7,000 business organisations have received fostering information with their Council Tax bill.

Derby City Council has around 390 children in care. The majority live with foster carers, with 40 youngsters living in six children's homes. Last month the Council's Fostering and Adoption Service received a good report from the Commission for Social Care Inspection, a Government body.




