### Schools Competition

#### RECOMMENDATION

- 1.1 For members and invited judges to award the prizes in the schools competition

#### SUPPORTING INFORMATION

- 2.1 The Climate Change Commission ran a competition for schools during March and April 2009. The finalists have been invited to the meeting on 16 June to present their entries to the Commission and the invited judges.
- 2.2 Eight entries were received in total – six from Walter Evans Primary School, one from Ravensdale Junior School and one from Lees Brook Comprehensive School. All entries were invited to be finalists. The entries will all be available for members to view prior to the meeting.
- 2.3 Each entrant will be given five minutes to explain their entry and the motivation behind it. Due to the large number of entries from Walter Evans Primary school, it was requested by the school that only one presentation be done by the pupils, as the different entries cover similar ideas, and not all the teams would be available for the 16 June meeting.
- 2.4 The total available prize fund is £1250. It is suggested that the Commission and judges may wish to consider how best to award this to the different entries. It may be possible to award more, although smaller, prizes than originally stated if that is deemed appropriate.
