All local authorities were required to produce Primary Strategy for Change indicating how the funding will help address issues such as low attainment, deprivation, building condition need and surplus places. One of the key recommendations contained in the document relates to area reviews in those areas of the city where such issues exist. The area reviews that have been identified are as follows:

The first Area Review will be the primary schools in Derwent, Chaddesden and Oakwood, and initial discussions are scheduled to start in January 2009, with the aim of reporting the outcome of this review to Council Cabinet in April 2009. The preliminary work in readiness for this review, including data analysis has been completed.
