

Children in Care Council

SUMMARY

- 1.1 The Corporate Parenting Sub-Commission received a report on the Children in Care Council (CiCC) at its meeting on 14 December 2011. The sub-commission received and commented on a Pledge which had been written by the CiCC.
- 1.2 The Commission asked that the Chair of the sub-commission and the Overview and Scrutiny Officer attend the next CiCC meeting and that they developed links with the CiCC on behalf of the sub-commission.
- 1.3 The Chair and Overview and Scrutiny Officer attended a CiCC meeting on 11 January 2012.
- 1.4 The Chair and Officer gave a short presentation to the CiCC about how the Council takes decisions and how the Corporate Parenting Commission could support the CiCC with their work.
- 1.5 The Chair of the sub-commission and the CiCC agreed to share minutes of meetings with each other.
- 1.6 It was agreed that if the CiCC had issues that they felt the sub-commission could help them with they would contact the Overview and Scrutiny Support Officer and these issues would be escalated as necessary.
- 1.7 Equally if the Chair/Vice Chair of the sub-commission felt there were issues on the CiCC minutes that they wished to receive further information on they would request a report on the sub-commission's behalf to come to the next meeting.
