Quad Presentation

Peter outlined that the Quad project was the name of the Derby Visual Arts and Media Centre. The building will be the new home for Q Arts, the Metro Cinema and the Media Archive for Central England.

The Quad building will be located on the Market Place next to, though separate from the Assembly Rooms. It will form one of a cluster of cultural buildings in the centre of Derby. It is planned that the building will open in November 2007 allowing three and a half years to raise the capital funding and design and construct the building.

Peter explained that the building would contain:

Visual arts – exhibition space, workshops, multimedia studios and facilities, darkrooms and artists' studio

Cinema – 3 cinemas (290, 150, and 90 seats), education and meeting room, and central projection box

Media archive (MACE) - viewing and exhibition space

Central resources – entrance area and reception, café/bar, booking office, administration offices, and cultural industries workspaces

Central systems – integrated IT/digital structures and web presences

Councillor Webb confirmed that the Council cabinet had selected the architect for the project following extensive public consultation, but the buildings design had not yet been finalised. This would be the subject of further consultation. Councillor Webb commented, and Peter agreed that, even at this early stage it was important that disabled people had the opportunity to comment on the early design concepts, and principles under consideration.

Comments

A number of focus group members raised the issue of parking. Peter commented that there were no proposals for the building to have it's own dedicated parking. The Assembly Rooms car park would be the nearest available public car park. Members commented that in their view there was an underprovision of disabled people's parking spaces in the car park to cope with current demand, and that this would definitely need to be reviewed before the Quad building opened. Comment was also made about the current "difficulties" with the Pay-on-exit" parking system.

Members also highlighted the following issues:

Clarity of signage

Wheelchair user sightlines, and seating arrangements

Lighting levels

Seating choice

Public transport links

All agreed that the meeting had been an important first step in understanding and commenting upon this important cultural project. Members felt that a further meeting was required to consider the detail of the proposals was required. It was also suggested that representatives from Q Arts and the Metro Cinema

be invited to the next meeting. Peter agreed that this would be a good idea.

Matters arising

Several members still had concerns regarding certain aspects of the detailed implementation of Connecting Derby (CD). It was agreed that an invitation would be extended to a representative of the CD project time to attend the next meeting.

Councillor Webb commented that the consultation period for the proposed highway work at the Five Lamps had just ended. A planning application for the work would be submitted shortly.

Councillor Webb raised the matter of the issuing of RADAR keys. Mick commented that there was an extensive list of people who had been issued with a key. Due, however to Data Protection Act issues the list could not be distributed to a third party.

Mick did however comment that there were important issues arising from the issue, and use of RADAR keys both locally, and nationally. Mick felt that it was appropriate to perhaps have this issue on the agenda of the groups next meeting. This was agreed.

Lifting device guidelines

Mick had distributed guidelines to assist Building Consultancy colleagues in determining compliance with Building Regulation accessibility guidance. Members agreed to consider the guidelines in the context of the Part M presentation to follow.

Derby Station footbridge

Mick confirmed that the new station footbridge would be built without lift access. Members were disappointed that despite all the representations the new structure would be inaccessible to some passengers. Marta commented that she would not be surprised if a challenge under the DDA was launched after October.

Building Regulations – Part M presentation

An extensive presentation was given by Mick on the new Part M of the Building Regulations. The regulation relate to the accessibility of buildings to all users, including disabled people. Feedback from members was that they found it very helpful, and informative.

Any other business

Councillor Webb raised concerns about the level of provision for Blue Badge holder on-street parking around the Park farm centre at Allestree. Mick commented that he would discuss this matter with highway colleagues, and report back at the next meeting.
