ADVERTISING ON PRIVATE HIRE RICKSHAWS

RECOMMENDATION

- 1.1 To consider waiving the condition prohibiting advertising on Private Hire Rickshaws.
- 1.2 To review the waiver, if granted, in 12 months.

SUPPORTING INFORMATION

- 2.1 On 9 July 2008 the Taxi Licensing & Appeals Committee agreed to licence Rickshaws as hackney carriage or private hire vehicles and their riders as hackney carriage or private hire vehicle drivers, subject to the applicant meeting the existing conditions for the respective licence.
- 2.2 In February 2009 the Council received an application from East Midlands Rickshaws to operate a private hire vehicle.
- 2.3 The applicant proposes to run limited, set routes through the city centre, initially to and from Iron Gate, the Market Place and Westfield Centre.
- 2.4 The business will operate on a no fee basis, relying on advertising from local businesses as its sole income.
- 2.5 Customers will obtain a token from one of the booking sites, the Tourist Information Centre in the Market Place or the Westfield Centre before starting their journey.
- 2.6 Currently, private hire vehicles are not permitted to advertise anywhere on the vehicle, inside or out, due to the potential confusion it may pose to customers when trying to identify their booked vehicle. Committee are asked to waive the existing condition prohibiting advertising, as public confusion is unlikely to occur with this unique design of vehicle.
- 2.7 The existing condition for private hire motor vehicles will remain in force.
