"Council is disappointed by the Home Secretary's decision not to hold a formal inquiry into the policing of events at Orgreave on 18 June 1984. Council notes that 95 miners, including many from Derbyshire, were arrested and charged with riot offences, but were all subsequently acquitted amid accusations that evidence against them had been fabricated.

"Council further notes the findings of the Independent Police Complaints Commission which found in a report of June 2015 that there was: 'evidence of excessive violence by police officers, a false narrative from police exaggerating violence by miners, perjury by officers giving evidence to prosecute the arrested men, and an apparent cover-up of that perjury by senior officers'.

"Under these circumstances, it is disappointing that the concerns of miners, their families and communities have been ignored.
