67/17 Council budget proposals and Council Tax 2018/9

Members were presented with the minutes of the Council Cabinet 99/17 (Council Tax Base for 2018/9) and 101/17 (Council Budget Proposals 2018/9) for approval. Council was also provided with a report consolidating all of the budget and Council Tax proposals. The Mayor had confirmed that the matters would be considered collectively and Council Procedure Rules would be varied to enable Group Leaders to all speak for 15 minutes in response to the Leader moving the proposals.

The proposals before Council were moved by Councillor Banwait, and seconded by Councillor Rawson. Councillors M Holmes, Skelton and Graves spoke in response.

It was moved by Councillor M Holmes, and seconded by Councillor Grimadell, that the proposals be amended by the addition of the following words in the resolution:

"That the budget is approved subject to the council committing to the reopening of the Assembly Rooms, including refurbishment to be carried out to ensure modern fire and other regulatory requirements are met and that the venue can be brought back into use to provide concerts, performances, conferences and events, at a cost of £10.2m to be funded by:

- The allocation of £8.6m of LGF Funding that has already been secured, following appropriate consultation with the Local Enterprise Partnership;
- The allocation of £1.6m of the remaining fire insurance monies;
- Council reserves providing contingency cover if required;

And that the remaining capital budget of £35.4m allocated to provide a new performance venue programme to be removed and reassessed, creating a revenue saving of £1.5m per year from 2020/21 due to the removal of the borrowing requirement;

And that the existing allocation of £550,000 for the new performance venue is instead allocated to fund an options assessment for an affordable capital programme of improvements to the Assembly Rooms to be carried out, to provide:

- Increased front-facing market place leisure/retail offer;
- Associated multi-storey car park rebuild and/or refurbishment to increase the (car park) capacity;

And that a commercial partner will also be sought to manage the venue and/or Derby Live tasked to demonstrate a suitable business model that refocuses efforts to provide regular commercially-focused conference/similar events with a supporting programme of concerts and productions;

With the aim of these capital investments and management model being to deal with historic ongoing taxpayer subsidy required of a performance venue, and any operating revenue subsidy required in the interim being met via reserves for a period of two years from re-opening."
