3/14	Matters Arising not on the agenda <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Funding certificates for community organisations which received Board in previous years have now been distributed, noted some are being displayed. Evaluation forms outstanding from Phil Raffle at Vocal Tenants and Residents Association and need to be provided – ACTION Richard Smail Section 106 update – Councillor Bolton reported on an update received from Helen Acton regarding the Public Art project and outlining that an artist has been employed, designs due in September, to complete by February 2015. 4/14	Chairs Report and late items <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Iceland store due to open on Tuesday 8 July • Big 1 was a success and many thanks to those who attended and looked after the Neighbourhood Boards stall, especially Adam Hulatt • Chaddesden Lane Highway improvements on target to hopefully finish by 15 August • Letter received from the Morley Road Neighbourhood Watch group thanking the Board for the flower displays around the ward and in particular the one on Morley Road as part of Chaddesden in Bloom.

6/14	Police report Sergeant Beeston reported: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • New Police Constable in post at Roe Farm, Police Constable Drew • Update on Police priorities • Auto crime reduced • Anti-Social Behaviour at Roosevelt Ave increased and patrol plans are in place • New Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) Patrols set up on Friday and Saturday nights across Derby North to focus on ASB only to target hotspots, in first week names of some people involved in ASB taken • ASB on Chaddesden Park reduced • Dwelling burglaries reduced • Non dwelling burglaries increased. Police still offering the remaining shed alarms purchased by the Board plus leaflet drops with advice • Theft from and theft of vehicles decreased • Three males recently arrested who had been responsible for number of incidents around Chaddesden Park <p>A lengthy discussion about the recent shed break-ins at Chaddesden Park Allotments when about fifty sheds were broken into. Chris Potter requested reassurance for allotment holders that the Police are responding appropriately with additional patrols and investigations.</p> <p>Sergeant Beeston outlined that the incidents were a one off and no additional patrols had been put in place. It was important that the allotment holders took every precaution to prevent them being a victim by using the alarms and SmartWater which had been provided two years earlier and making their sheds secure.</p> <p>Chris Potter stated that the allotments have their own battery powered closed circuit television system, but was there any other local closed circuit television such as on the park that Police could view to gather evidence?</p> <p>Maybe the hedges could be cut lower?</p> <p>Sergeant Beeston reported he is looking to work with the Council to see if the hedges can be cut back. Fitting shed alarms can help and can attract attention but they cannot be relied upon in isolated locations. He explained that if no</p>	

	<p>evidence is left at a scene then the forensics team are not used.</p> <p>ASB on Roosevelt Avenue – young people gathering around the shopping area especially by Best One. Police developing a patrol strategy.</p> <p>Concerns raised about Mephedrone use in the area. Sergeant Beeston confirmed drug testing is taking place in schools along with education talks with Year 9 pupils. Warrants have been issued in the community for those where evidence suggests they are selling drugs.</p>	
7/14	<p>Chaddesden Neighbourhood Board Outturn report 2013/14</p> <p>The Board noted the report.</p>	
8/14	<p>Neighbourhood Board Budgets and Funding Applications for 2014/15</p> <p>The Board noted the Community Budget of £18,347 and that an additional £1,058.44 was available from previous years to re allocate and also an additional £1.45 was carried forward. Board considered proposals for funding as listed below:</p> <p>The Board noted the in principle decision made in March 2014 to fund Children and Young People Service to deliver the Youth Club in 2014/15, Sporting Communities positive activities and OZBox room hire costs for 2014/15 which were approved by the Ward Committee.</p> <p>1. Children and Young People Service - Youth Club, £3,838</p> <p>Eddie Fisher reported on the successful interventions being delivered by the Youth Services Youth Club at Chesapeake and thanked the Board for their support in 2013/14.</p> <p>Over 30 attend each week. Noted many young people go to Roosevelt shops after the session. Eddie confirmed looking for funding from other sources. Approved with conditions to recognise support of the board in publicity and to look for other funds to help sustain the future of the youth club.</p> <p>2. Sporting Communities – positive activities £4,576</p> <p>David Walsh reported on the weekly two hour sessions which are well attended and noted some go to the shops after the sessions. Some of the young people are attending the Street Games tournaments, Community event being held on Saturday 26 July at the Chesapeake Centre, families are invited. Two extra sessions are being delivered over summer. Approved with conditions to recognise support of the Board in publicity.</p> <p>3. Derwent Stepping Stones - OzBox Room hire, £612</p> <p>The Board also noted the successful work of the OzBox sessions and agreed to fund the room hire until March 2015 at the Chesapeake Community Centre with conditions OzBox to acknowledge funding provided by the Board and to provide reports to future meetings outlining numbers attending and progress with the project. Funding to be paid to Derwent Stepping Stones for the room hire.</p> <p>4. Cypress Walk Lighting Column - £2,676.86</p>	

Agreed to contribute Community Budget funding to cover the costs of energy and maintenance and to make up the costs for the lighting column itself not funded from the Streetpride devolved budget. Agreed that a sticker or notice is put on the column to recognise the Board funding.

5. Donegal Walk - street nameplate - £150

Agreed to fund the missing name plate for Donegal Walk with the request that recognition of the funding from the Board is put on it.

Streetpride Devolved Budget 2014/15 Streetpride Spend Plan

The Board noted the report outlining the 2014/15 spend plan and agreed the following amendments based on a budget of £22,934. The Board agreed:

- Two March Spring Clean Days – to delegate to the Highways Sub group to agree how to promote and fund the promotional leaflets plus their distribution – could consider scouts again. Same routes as 2014 to cover the entire ward. The Sub group to make recommendations to the Board.
- Civil Enforcement Officer additional time – confirmed 30 extra hours available. To delegate to Highways sub group to agree details and consider first couple of football home games and school parking campaign in October.
- Road Safety and Cycling projects – request Traffic Management to

provide feedback on progress to deliver these projects. Board expects the schools to be informing parents that this was funded by the Board.
