1. Purpose of the report

To provide the Derbyshire Adults and Health Scrutiny Review Board with an update on the progress of Primary Care Access.

2. Information & analysis

GP Forward View has been rolled out across all of Derbyshire and has significantly increased access to primary care with 80% of practices participating since September 2018 to 100% of practices in October 2018. Hubs are operating additional appointments daily 6.30-8pm and a minimum of 3 hours Saturday and Sunday mornings. With the introduction of Extended Access there are now 108,264 additional bookable primary care appointments over 7 days including Bank Holidays available.

There are 14 models of delivery ranging from static to rotating hubs to meet the needs of the local population. More rural areas have opted for rotating hubs.

Current utilisation on weekdays is 82%. Utilisation on Saturdays 85% and Sundays 51%

Local and National communication was released in December to raise public awareness of Extended Access Hubs. All 116 practices across Derbyshire have Extended Access information on their websites.

The additional capacity in the system should improve people's ability to secure an appointment with their practice in a timelier manner. Longer opening hours within the EA hubs will ensure working age people have access to appointments outside of standard work hours.

There are still issues of getting through to practices at peak times over the phone. Having services available 7 days a week will help to improve this.

There is an ambition to enable 111 to direct book into the Extended Access appointments by the 1 April 2019 across Derbyshire with a longer term move toward 111 being able to book into 'in hour's' appointments.

The CCG as part of the GP Five Year Forward View has a workforce group in liaison with the LMC looking at the development of the Primary Care workforce. This includes recruitment and retention of GPs and Practice nurses, increasing skill mix within practices and ensuring patients are seen by the right person first time. All will help with access.
