SUSPENSION NOTICES

Since 25 April 2012, the Authority has been able to serve a suspension notice on those who hold a licence under the Licensing Act 2003, who had not paid their annual fees.

109 suspension notices were issued during the period. The total outstanding was £26,810. 82 paid realising £22,590. Of the remainder, 5 licences were surrendered and £680 in fees were cancelled. 2 licences lapsed due to company insolvency, which means £360 is due to be written off.

The remaining 20 licences comprise of unoccupied premises or businesses not currently trading. Fees will need to be paid in full before the suspension notices are lifted and trading can recommence. The total outstanding fees from these premises total £3180.
