CALCULATING PRIVATE HIRE OPERATORS LICENCE FEES

RECOMMENDATION

- 1.1 To consider the information set out in this report and approve the 'flat rate plus per vehicle charge' as the method for calculating private hire operator licence fees.
- 1.2 To agree the method chosen to calculate Operators Licence fees be used each subsequent year.

SUPPORTING INFORMATION

- 2.1 Each year, Committee is asked to approve the fees and charges for taxi related licences. The taxi licensing fees and charges are based on a 'cost accounting' exercise and this has identified that £19,872 is recoverable from Operators licence fees in 2009/10.
- 2.2 In the past, Committee has considered a number of different ways of recovering this amount from Operators.
- 2.3 The Council currently licences around eighty operators. The number of vehicles they run varies considerably. Some of our licence holders operate a single vehicle whilst others have up to 200 vehicles on their books. It is therefore very important that the method used to calculate their operator licence fees is fair, equitable and reflects this variation.
- 2.4 Officers have examined the different ways available to calculate operator licence fees and consider the fairest method to choose is a 'flat rate plus per vehicle charge'. This includes a fee that every operator pays along with an additional element for each vehicle the operator runs. The 'flat rate' part of the calculation can be set to reflect the administration costs of issuing the Operators Licence and the 'per vehicle' charge can be set to raise the remaining amount of recoverable fees.
- 2.5 The proposed method for calculating operators licence fees along with the proposed fees is set out at Appendix 2.
