


# What is Congenital Heart Disease (CHD)?

- Defects in a child's heart that develop in the womb and are present at birth.
- Life-long condition, often requiring extremely complex treatment.
- Relatively rare. On average a Primary Care
   Trust has 20 children each year requiring heart
   surgery.
- 85% of children survive into adulthood.

# Engagement with parents, young people & clinicians

- 22 October 2009; National event for professions & parents-200 delegates gave feedback on potential model of care & draft standards
- The Children's Heart Foundation canvassed the views of parents-5,000 questionnaires
- □ National stakeholder event October 2009-Overview & Scrutiny Committee (OSC) and LINKs invited
- □ "Need for Change" published April 2010 & 10 engagement events across England in Spring of 2010-1,000 attendees
- Autumn 2010 OSCs received briefings on the review & asked how they would wish to be consulted as part of the formal consultation
- Evaluation criteria- Views from 4 stakeholder groups. July 2010 (Steering group, Specialised Commissioning Groups, Parents and Clinicians)

## **Short listing Options**

- □ 2047 Possible configurations
- ☐ Thresholds apply
  - Minimum number of procedures
  - Assessment panel ranking
  - Best possible "fit" in terms of access to service across England & Wales
- ☐ Gave initial set of 15 options
- ☐ Fixed points linked to activity thresholds
  - 6 or 7 sites
  - London 2 centres
  - Oxford discounted
  - Birmingham remain due to high number of referrals
  - Southampton & Bristol- both not viable in some configuration
  - North OF England- 2 centres

## What are we consulting on

- □ The proposed national standards
- □ The network approach
- ☐ The proposed options for reconfiguring the service

### Engagement: How we will consult

- A four-month formal public consultation was launched on 28<sup>th</sup> February
- HOSCs, parents, clinicians, young people and professional bodies will all be encouraged to take part
- Decision on the options put forward to consultation and the process underpinning it made in public (February 2011)
- Consultation materials widely available: eg newsletter
- Over 15 face to face events around the country, including three events specifically for young people
- Trusts will hold events for their staff
- Website
- We are working with local commissioners to reach populations according to local needs

### Timeline

- 1 July 2011 formal consultation ends
- July to Sept 2011 analysis of consultation by independent third party
- Autumn JCPCT considers outcome of consultation and a decision is reached
- 2013 implementation
