Brown Bins Collection in Part of Normanton

Derby City Council will start collecting brown bins (for food, cardboard and garden waste) from part of Normanton in Derby on Monday 5 March. About 1,500 householders in streets around Mill Hill Lane are getting the brown bins, in addition to the blue bins for tins, glass and plastic bottles that they already have. The Council held a Rethink Rubbish recycling road show last week and delivered leaflets to residents to explain the change to the system in their area.



Wednesday 21 March 2007 (Area 3)

During the week, the Council will be putting extra effort into cleaning up the city centre and will blitz rubbish or graffiti hot spots identified by residents in various districts.

Dealing With Waste in the Future

Derbyshire residents are being asked to help in the search for new sites to deal with waste. Landfill sites are running out and by 2010 government guidelines will mean councils must bury less or face fines. Derbyshire County Council and Derby City Council are looking at new ways of dealing with waste, to recognise it as a resource and not rubbish. A list of "preferred options" will be drawn up and in September 2007 people will be asked for views.
