It would be a considerable benefit (to residents in particular) if a summary was provided which explained how the local authority can be enabled to address social and welfare issues without reliance on the gambling businesses to provide a risk assessment. A criticism so deficiency is the ease with which premises can open with minimal obligations relating to change of use. The critical issue is not large 'family venues' but local betting shops geared to deriving revenue in deprived areas

This duplicates several points in itself I.e. repeats requirements, sometimes a few paragraphs apart. I suspect this is more likely because of persons failing to understand or read points in previous versions and/or to emphasise new expectations (such as sharing their risk assessments) rather than errors in it's production.

I think gambling would go underground if banned but needs strong control.

The principles are only useful if vigorously enforced and applied.
