Derby City Council	In the 2018/19 financial year to date there have been: 126 needle exchange transactions; one issuances of oral emergency contraception; and 889 supervised consumptions of methadone/buprenorphine. These are the services commissioned by Public Health. This compares to an average of 1106 needle exchange transactions; 36 issuances of oral emergency contraception and 3882 supervised consumptions of methadone/buprenorphine (in other similar pharmacies). The volume of activity at the pharmacy to be disestablished is small and the availability of all services at nearby pharmacies would mean sustained accessibility for PH clients. <i>11/12/2018</i>

As stated the difficulty in assessing the loss of the face-to-face aspect of this consolidation is very tricky, and not sure has an actual solution. As an observation, there does appear be a geographical gap in this area re Community Pharmacy, however this is a small gap (as you state in document approx. 1.2 miles) so in real terms is not a true gap and is in line with guidance. 19/12/2018
