Work Programme

SUMMARY

- carry out policy development and review functions as shown in Article 6 of the constitution that they consider to be necessary
- provide an annual report to full Council on their workings and make recommendations for future work programmes
- carry out any other statutory duties and responsibilities allocated to local authority scrutiny committees.
- 4.2 The Terms of Reference for this board covers the following service areas, and fully encompasses the portfolio of the Cabinet Member for Children and Young People:
 - School Organisation and provision
 - Quality Standards and performance
 - Inclusion and intervention
 - Early Intervention
 - Safeguarding Children
 - Disabled Children's services
 - Children in Care
 - Adult Learning
 - Children and Young peoples commissioning
- 4.3 This item gives members an opportunity to consider and comment upon the work programme for the 2018/19 municipal year.
- 4.4 The work programme is not restrictive and board members can identify and introduce items for scrutiny throughout the year. Items for scrutiny will be discussed at premeetings with the Chair and Vice Chair, and will be added to the Scrutiny Board agenda at the Chair's discretion.
