

Derby City Council Election Cycle CONSULTATION

We want to know your views on how often we hold local elections

What is this survey about?

Derby City Council currently holds Local Elections three times in every four years, with a third of seats contested at each election. There is one year where no Local Elections take place. This is known as the 'fallow year'.

We are considering adopting a 'Whole Council Elections' model, whereby one election would be held every four years starting from 2022.

We last considered adopting a 'Whole Council Elections' model in 2016. Although this did not receive the required support of two-thirds of councillors, our consultation showed that residents of Derby supported this idea.

Since 2016 the Council has changed significantly. We now have an entirely different political and administrative leadership. As a result, a resolution was made by our councillors in November 2019 to revisit the decision.

As next year is a 'fallow year' under our current model, Local Elections will not be held in 2021. This makes 2020 a good time for this change to be considered. After Local Elections this May, Political Parties and the Council would have two years to prepare for our first 'Whole Council Election' in 2022, if councillors were to approve this change.

We would like to hear the views of everyone who lives in Derby on this matter. We would like to know whether you support changing to a 'Whole Council Elections' model or whether you would prefer us to keep our current 'Elections by Thirds' model.

Background information

Current arrangements - 'Elections by Thirds'

Under Derby's current model, voters go to the polls three times in every four years. On each occasion voting for 17 of the city's 51 councillors, except in the fourth year when there are no elections. This is known as a 'fallow year'.

Alternative arrangements - 'Whole Council Elections'

Under this model, voters would go to the polls once every four years, but all 51 of the available seats would be contested at the same time. Under this model there would be no Local Elections during the intervening period, unless a by-election was required for a councillor resignation, retirement or other reason.


What do other councils do?

There are 55 Unitary Authorities like Derby in England. Derby is one of 17 of the Unitary Authorities across England which hosts 'elections by thirds', with the remaining 38 councils use the 'whole council elections' model.

So which is better?

Both models have their own advantages and disadvantages, which is why we want you to tell us which one you prefer. Please view some of the advantages of each model below:

Allows electors the opportunity to vote more frequently, meaning there is a greater immediate political accountability Residents who already regularly vote in elections are used to going Whole Council Elections Greater continuity provides more certainty and stability between elections, which helps longer-term planning Easier to understand systems could increase turnout and would bring



Reduces the risk of by-elections costs as elections are scheduled more often



Would save approximately £475,000 over four years due to fewer elections

What happens next?

We will use the responses to help councillors decide whether to continue using the current model by thirds or if not make changes to the election cycle in Derby. We will hold a special Council meeting to consider the proposal. If at this meeting a two-thirds majority of councillors support a change to the election cycle, the motion will be passed and we will move to four yearly 'Whole Council Elections'.

If the Council opted to change to 'Whole Council Elections', these would take place in 2022 and every four years after that. If the current system is retained, there would be a 'fallow year' without elections in 2021 followed by elections in 2022, 2023 and 2024.

The Local Elections due to be held on Thursday 7 May are unaffected by these proposals.

This consultation will be open for residents to have their say until Monday 23 March 2020.
